

FARM BILL: A D.C. REPORT

Slow Walking the Farm Bill

One of the biggest spends of the U.S Government is the Farm Bill. The 2018 version which amounted to \$428 billion is set to expire on 30 September 2023 and needs to be replaced. That means the U.S. agriculture community, food producers and processors, and state, local, tribal and federal officials have turned their attention to the Farm Bill's reauthorization. And, this is where it gets interesting.

I recently attended a legislative staffing regarding the new farm bill and several things seem to be clear. First of all, four areas, nutrition (76 percent), crop insurance (9 percent), commodities (7 percent) and conservation (7 percent) – account for 99 percent of all Farm Bill expenditures. While nutrition will always be an important topic in these Farm Bill negotiations, the conservation title is increasing in profile and importance, reflecting the Biden Administration's emphasis on addressing climate change through improved agricultural practices, often referred to as "climate-smart agriculture."

That being said, it is clear from my meeting in D.C., there is a concerted effort to "slow walk" the negotiations in advance of the mid-term elections that is expected to turn over control of the U.S. House to the Republicans. That, could change the dynamic when it comes to climate.

One of the common themes I heard is there is agreement

between both parties to downplay the "Rural-Urban Divide" when it comes to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) or "food stamps". There has long been a misconception that urban areas of the country benefit the most from SNAP. However, several studies conducted



late last year indicate that food stamps have more than twice the impact on rural communities than urban economies.

The study by the U.S. Department of Agriculture shows SNAP benefits increased economic output by 1.25% in rural areas compared to 0.53% in urban areas. The total number of jobs the benefit added to non-metropolitan areas increased by 1.18%, compared to 0.5% in metro areas.

A senate staff member of a senior GOP Senator who represents a rural state said to me, "It's important that our rural residents and businesses realize that SNAP is a tremendous boost to the rural economy and both Democrats and Republicans are focused on telling that story."

A rare bit of bipartisanship being played out in Washington.

So looking forward to seeing folks in July during our Summer Board Meeting. Until then, safe travels and keep being the great family we all appreciate so much.



How a trusted contact person may help you avoid financial exploitation Provided by RBC Wealth Management and Craig Shaver, Financial Advisor

Financial exploitation is a growing problem for American retirees and their families. It's important to be familiar with common scams—such as being contacted about an unexpected windfall or an investment opportunity that sounds too good to be true. But more than knowing the warning signs of exploitation, it's equally important to be proactive about its prevention.

A simple, yet effective way to help avoid the risk of potential exploitation is to provide a trusted contact person on your accounts who can be called on in certain circumstances to protect your assets and respond to possible financial exploitation. This trusted contact person might be a family member or a friend. Or it might be a professional you depend upon, like an attorney or accountant.

A trusted contact person is someone you authorize your financial advisor to contact only if they are unable to reach you directly. This person is not an authorized party on your account(s) and your financial advisor will not accept instructions from them to effect transactions and/or change account information.

Hypothetical example

Let's say you and a spouse have a joint account with check writing capability, and you are on a cruise together. Let's also say your financial advisor notices a large transaction on your account that is not typical for you. The advisor is unable to reach you to verify the authenticity of the transaction and is concerned this is fraud. The good news is: you provided a close sibling as your trusted contact person. Your advisor follows up with them and is able to locate you to verify if the charge is valid.

FINRA, the securities industry self-regulatory organization, has actually made the practice of naming a trusted contact into a rule, and requires that your financial advisor ask you if you would like to name a trusted contact person at the time you open or make material changes to your account(s). It's a good idea, is easy to do, and could help you avoid financial exploitation in the future.

ECONOMIC NEWS

CONSUMERS ARE SHIFTING

Over the past several months we've seen a shift in consumer spending. No longer are consumers buying stuff...they are now buying experiences...dinners out and travel. That shift is causing troubles for retailers. And it's being played out in the numbers. Shares of Target plunged 29% in May, their worst month since October 1987 and second worst monthly performance on record. Walmart stock saw a 16% drop in May, its worst month since January 2009. The S&P 500 index's consumer discretionary and consumer staples sectors each fell almost 5% in May, according to FactSet data. Only real estate fared worse, with losses of more than 5% for the month. But...travel and hospitality spending... is up.

HOUSING

Home price growth hit a record high in March, as fierce competition among would-be buyers for the limited supply of properties continued to power a seller's market. Nationally, home prices were 20.6% higher than in March last year according to the S&P CoreLogic Case-Shiller Home Price Index. That's above the 20% annual growth seen in March of last year and is the highest year-over-year increase in more than three decades. Sunbelt cities saw the fastest rises. Prices climbed 34.8% in Tampa, Fla., 32.4% in Phoenix and 32% in Miami. With home prices sky-high and the average mortgage rate now above 5%, price growth is expected to slow in coming months. But...if you own your home...you are sitting on a pile of cash.

TWITTER

Twitter shareholders are suing Elon Musk over the Tesla CEO's chaotic bid to buy the social media platform, accusing the billionaire of trying to manipulate the company's stock. The proposed class-action lawsuit focuses on Musk's recent comments that the takeover is on hold until he gets more information on the number of bots and fake accounts on the platform.

Those comments, the lawsuit alleges, were intended "to drive down Twitter's stock price" so that Musk could then "back out of the purchase or re-negotiate the buyout price."

Since Musk announced his takeover deal, Twitter's share price has dropped more than 12%.
