

A friend who owns a farm in Oklahoma told me about his plan to power his farm totally with solar cells. I thought that was a really good idea and asked how he planned to go about getting it done.

He had checked with area solar contracting companies about installation and discovered that, even with government incentives, he was looking at far too many thousands of dollars to make the idea practical. He is a master truck mechanic by trade and decided, "How hard could it be?" Turns out he was able to purchase all of the necessary parts for about \$10,000 and that was for enough cells to provide double the power needs of his farm. He showed me a chart that indicated that his \$10,000 investment would be recovered in 6 years. The expected system life on the chart was 20 years and the anticipated savings per year grew with expected increases in power costs over that period.

The farm is about 130 acres with a lake. However, much of it is covered with trees. Locating that large an area to install the cells with enough sunlight and without interfering with farming operations was a problem. A good part of the farm is set aside for cattle grazing. Also the cell field needed to be reasonably close to the source of the public power system. The solution was to put the cells on poles high enough for the cattle to walk under.

While not all power companies will allow excess electricity from residential sources, he was able to make an arrangement with the company he is using. If all of this worked out, he would not pay any electricity bill. It sounds great, but nothing is that easy. It turns out that the power company does not want him to produce more than 125% of his usual electrical needs. No one seems to know exactly why. He is still trying to figure out how to comply with this requirement. His solar system does not currently have backup so he will have to use electricity from the power company during cloudy weather and at night. This whole situation will result in still needing some power from the electric company and may still run his electric meter forward rather than backward as he had planned.

The best he can do is to have no electric bill if his monthly usage is equal to or less than that produced by the solar cells, plus that required from the power company. The power company will never pay him for any excess electricity he may produce. The initial system is now complete and generating capability is even better than expected. Power is produced even at sundown and during periods of overcast and rain. The trick will be to find a way to calculate and stay under the power company's required 125% production limit.

In view of the restrictions from the power company that would undermine his ability to achieve a zero electric bill, my friend is considering installing a battery and generator backup system that would allow him to disconnect from the public power grid completely. Obviously, this would be a substantial additional expense. But, the total would still be much less than if he had used a contractor to do just the originally planned system. I will be interested in following this project to see if the expected return on investment is actually realized. Something for a future article.






