

Mr. Griggs,

I recently stumbled across your message in the Winter 2011 edition of Bulletin and it has made me think a great deal about change. It also has prompted me to write this email as a way of updating the NTPDA on the status of your investment in my change. I received a scholarship from the NTPDA in the Spring of 2009 while I was still in the early stages of changing my life from the bottom up. A high school dropout with no real prospects should I fail in my crazy scheme, I was attending Schreiner University in Kerrville with very lofty goals.

At the time that I received this scholarship, I had so far been very successful at this small university and was immersing myself in a wide variety of activities in the community. I have been very active in several local theatres, and have had parts in six major productions. I attend a local church where I sing in the choir and have enjoyed working with the children during Vacation Bible School for the last four summers. I've been an instructor for the American Red Cross teaching First Aid, CPR, and other life-saving skills since 2009. I had the good fortune to accept a position as a peer tutor during my first year at Schreiner. My work as a peer tutor led to my also being hired as a specialty tutor for students with learning disabilities, a position I still hold today.

Although I was successful in every endeavor, there was one thing that I wanted to change. I still labeled myself as a high school dropout. Last May, that change finally came. I graduated as the Valedictorian of the Schreiner University Class of 2011. It was the first time in the history of the school that this distinction had been awarded to someone from the Exercise Science Department. Following Commencement, I completed a certification program to become an EMT Basic, still working to reach my lofty goal. In the Summer of 2011 I began the long process of applying to medical school. I was invited in November to interview at the Texas Tech Health Sciences Center Paul L. Foster School of Medicine in El Paso. Following my interview, I was offered an early acceptance to the PLFSOM. I have accepted this offer and in July will continue with the radical process of change I started almost five years ago. I'm now at about the halfway point in my change from dropout to physician.

This is a process that would not have been possible without significant financial backing. The combination of scholarships from generous organizations such as the NTPDA have helped me enormously. Thank you for your work to help the NTPDA to change in ways that will hopefully keep this important program alive for future students. Please extend my appreciation to the members of the Board, the Scholarship Committee, and the members that make this possible.

Investopedia defines inflation as a sustained increase in the general level of prices for goods and services. It is measured as an annual percentage increase. As inflation rises, every dollar you own buys a smaller percentage of a good or service.

When many people hear the word inflation they think of rising prices. Rising prices are simply symptomatic of inflation.

Inflation is an increase in the money supply and available credit. When the supply of money increases people have more of it to offer for goods and services. If the supply of these goods and services lags (does not increase at the same or a slower rate) the price of goods will increase. As each individual dollar becomes less valuable because there are more dollars available-buyers offer more of them and prices of commodities rise even further.

Bob Livingston states in his book *Burning Your Money* anything that artificially increases aggregate demand for goods and services such as lowering interest rates, increasing credit or money printing (as the Fed has been doing with its

tion.

so-called quantitative easing) is infla-

policy that artificially created an "easy-money" policy encouraged its citizens to incur tremendous debt loads for new homes, new automobiles, and new appliances as the prices for all continued to rise. These policies encouraged businessmen to embark on business ventures and enticed investors to speculate on

real estate and securities that could not have been profitable under stable monetary conditions. The American Institute for Economic Research stated that real estate speculation became so rampant that it was considered an investment.

One of the most successful investors and accumulators of wealth in recent history has been Warren Buffet who abhors easy money. He and his lifelong business partner and friend Charlie Munger built an empire by investing in productive assets like farms or businesses and real estate that have the ability to deliver output while maintaining their purchasing power and requiring minimal continued capital investment. The Oracle of Omaha declares that governments determine the ultimate value of money and when their policies spin out of control, producing inflation to the point that it takes \$7 to purchase what \$1 did in 1965.

A recent article in *Forbes* noted that "Even in the U.S., where the wish for a stable currency is strong, the dollar has fallen a staggering 86% in value since 1965..."

Contained in the contemporary finance publication Crash *Proof.* Peter Schiff and John Downes write that inflation is the government's silent partner and is used to secretly confiscate the public's money:

There are five reasons for creating inflation:

- 1) Inflation makes the national debt more manageable because it can be repaid in cheaper dollars.
- 2) In a democracy full of personally indebted voters, the government will pursue monetary policies hospitable to debtors even as it accommodates the special interests that lend to them.
- 3) Inflation finances social programs that voters demand but avoids the politically unpopular alternative of higher taxes, allowing Uncle Sam to play Santa Claus.
- 4) Inflationary spending is confused with economic growth, which is confused with economic health. (Of course, GDP numbers are theoretically adjusted for inflation, but that doesn't mean much if the inflation figures are misrepresented.)
- 5) Inflation causes nominal asset prices to rise, such as those of stocks and real estate, instilling in the minds of voters the illusion of wealth creation even as the real purchasing power of their assets falls.


Se Just Blogging Away
